It was noted that the meeting had been properly noticed Online, in Leopolis and at Town Hall. It was decided that our inspection would include road surface conditions, Tree or brush issues, and deciding on the scope of 2021-22 and beyond projects. It was decided that Duane would drive and All would supply their opinion of general surface conditions.

Departed Town Hall at 8:05 AM to conduct the inspection.

The board Returned to the Town Hall at 12:20pm, reviewed our notes and will proceed with the following recommendations:

1. Patch Winkle Road by Goers Farms, where Manure Haulers tore up some road.
2. Brushing sites for this year.
Kroenke Creek, Rangeline, One Mile
and start on Winkle (where a number of dead and bigger trees need to be looked at)
3. Caution signs at Guard Rails on HIGHVIEW/Old A need to be put back up.
4. Grade gravel roads - Townline Road, Dillenberg Lane, and Cedar Lane
5. Look at adding some gravel on Cedar lane over top of corduroy that's showing through.
6. Address some of the washouts along Leopolis Road, get some recycled Asphalt to pack in there.
7. Contact County on Roosevelt Road Culvert. – Skim over for now, replace culvert later on.
8. Checked on Hole on Mill Creek Rd Bridge over the Creek...David Page to patch for now.
9. Main project will be to finish BUTTERNUT ROAD, West End towards Lower Lake. Notify County of PLSS Point Marking on replaced Asphalt Corner.
10. We Stopped and Looked at PELLA's Dump Trailer....
